

### Comparison of invasion of Wind-Heat and Latent Heat

	<b>Wind-Heat</b>	<b>Latent Heat</b>
Symptoms	Aversion to cold, sweating, fever	No aversion to cold (unless combined with new infection)
Cough	Cough	No cough
Pulse	Floating-Rapid	Rapid, also Wiry or Intermittent
Tongue	Thin white coating	Red tongue from the beginning
Pathology	Easy to have abnormal transmission to Pericardium	Easy to consume Yin and dry up fluids

### Comparison of Qi and Blood level in Latent Heat

	<b>Heat</b>	<b>Thirst</b>	<b>Skin spots</b>	<b>Tongue</b>	<b>Pulse</b>
Qi level	Apparent	Thirst, desire to drink	Papules	Red	Big
Blood level	Not so apparent	Dry mouth, no desire to drink	Macules	Deep-Red	Fine-Rapid
